

Brook Hill Farm Placement Application



We are looking for a Lifetime Commitment for our Rescue Horses!

Thank you for inquiring about adopting a horse from Brook Hill Farm. The goal of the farm is to place horses in a lifetime placement agreement. We will only offer you a horse that fits your requirements and the number of horses available for adoption varies from time to time. So please be patient – we want to be sure we have the right horse for you!

Once you have been paired with a horse, a placement agreement must be signed with the farm about the adopter's responsibilities. We do not have an adoption fee, however if the horse is returned we require a sixty day notice and a \$500 restocking fee in order to be able to initially financially care for the returned horse. Transportation back to Brook Hill Farm is the responsibility of the returning party, and it is required that all horses arrive with a current negative Coggins test, and all shots up to date.

The new adopter is responsible for:

- All health expenses incurred by the horse including annual shots, worming and hoof care
- Liability for the horse for any property damage, accident or injury that the horse may cause to the adopter, their family or others.
- The farm maintains a no-breeding policy for all of its horses.
- The farm is to be consulted if the horse is to change locations.
- The horse may not be bought, sold or traded.
- If the adopter is not able to care for the named horse it must be transferred back to Brook Hill Farm.
- The recipient agrees in advance that Brook Hill Farm has the right to obtain all veterinary records directly from any veterinarian treating the horse.
- To give a 60 day notice and a \$500 return fee, if the horse must be returned. All shots . Rhino Flu, Tetanus, Eastern Western Encephalitis, Coggins, West Nile, Rabies, Strangles, Potomac Horse Fever and a current coggins is required.
- Brook Hill Farm reserves the right to remove the horse if these requirements are not met.

The process to Adopt a horse is:

- A visit to Brook Hill Farm is **required**.
- A Horse Placement Application is to be completed.
- References listed by the applicant will be checked.
- The facility where the horse will be stabled is checked.
- The horse must pass a vet, farrier, trainer and staff evaluation in order to be released.
- An appropriate match meeting your needs is suggested and tried
- The committee votes on the application.
- The horse is signed over to the adopter.
- Any transportation costs are the responsibility of the adopter.

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Please include as much information as possible describing training, experience and the type of horse you are interested in. You may write on the back as needed.
